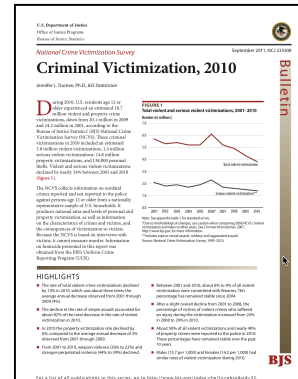

These stats are taken from the FBI Criminal Victimization Reports for the years indicated. The stats for domestic violence were not included in earlier reports- and the first ones to be reported were in the 2011 pdf document.

Some of the later reports showed the increase or decrease of reported cases for earlier years, but not all years were included in later reports.

There are no statistics for how many arrests were made for these reported crimes. It is possible that they were included under “Crimes against the Family” but there is no category for them in the ‘reported crimes’ or arrests for reported crimes.
