BIRMINGHAM, Alabama -- The horrific child sexual-abuse headlines keep invading our sports pages.

Penn State defensive coordinator Jerry Sandusky. Syracuse assistant basketball coach Bernie Fine. AAU president Bobby Dodd. Philadelphia Daily News sports columnist Bill Conlin.

And that's just since November.

ABC News revealed in 2010 that 36 swimming coaches had been banned by

USA Swimming for allegations of sexual misconduct, including molestation and hidden videotaping of children in locker rooms.

All of these allegations are sickening. I feel like never letting my young boys out of sight, which would be a complete overreaction, of course, so I'll try instead to teach them that they can tell my wife and I anything.

These victims are kids, the most vulnerable and innocent people in our society. If we can't protect them, something's seriously wrong.

We've reached American sports' Catholic Church moment.

Maybe this helps other victims come forward -- if not to prosecute criminals then to help themselves and prevent someone else from being abused. Maybe the rest of us won't turn a blind eye as adults did in some of these cases.

The sports world would miss a great opportunity if it simply shrugs its shoulders and writes off these stories as isolated incidents. Let's not bury our heads in the sand.

Let's demand better certification for our coaches, better laws to eliminate statutes of limitations in child molestation cases, and better training for parents, coaches and administrators to notice and report odd behavior.

Predators come in all walks of life. Take, for instance, the journalism world, which was stunned by the allegations against Conlin, a member of the Baseball Hall of Fame.

In any profession there are pedophiles. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, one in four girls and one in six boys are sexually abused before their 18th birthday.

Although the majority of adults associated with sports have the best of intentions when working with kids, the uncomfortable truth is sports can be ripe for sexual abuse and non-intervention. Children who are abused tend to know the adult. Sports provide the opportunity to build trust with adults who become authority figures.

As parents, we vet babysitters, schools and teachers. How often do we closely examine our children's relationships with their coaches? In sports, getting more attention from the coach is positive because the child must be playing well and there's a thirst to further his or her career and one day land a college scholarship.

Molestation is hardly a new issue in sports. Canada was rocked in the mid-1990s when junior hockey coach Graham James pleaded guilty to sexually assaulting two young players, including former NHL star Theo Fleury.

A 1995 survey of a sample of Canadian athletes by University of Winnipeg sociology professor Sandra Kirby revealed that 22.8 percent had sex with a coach or person of authority within their sport. Of those athletes, 8.5 percent reported the sex was forced, and 20 percent said it happened when they were under 16 years of age.

At the time, the United States Olympic Committee said one reason athletes did not report abuse was that are conditioned to follow a coach's direction. Also, the USOC said, allegations got turned back on the complainants as merely a misunderstanding.

That's why reactions in some of these latest high-profile cases came off as tone-deaf and inappropriate. Allegations are just that. The accused deserve their day in court.

But coming forward and admitting to being abused is extremely difficult, especially publicly. The victims can become stigmatized. So when Syracuse coach Jim Boeheim called the accusers of his longtime assistant "liars" looking for money, Boeheim badly stepped over the line and later apologized.

Sadly, we're probably not done opening our sports pages and reading of kids getting molested. If major universities such as Penn State and Syracuse couldn't prevent this under their noses, what else is happening in the dark shadows of sports?


