Owner of Gambling Business Admits Guilt in Bribing Police

A man the authorities describe as an organized crime figure admitted today that he had bribed West New York police officers to protect his multimillion-dollar gambling business in the largest police corruption case in state history. The guilty plea, by Jose Grana Sr. in Federal court in Camden, was the latest stemming from a 69-count indictment returned in January alleging that corruption turned the West New York Police Department into a racketeering gang.

Two Admit Bribing West New York Police

Two business owners in West New York, N.J., have pleaded guilty in a widening corruption case to making payments to police officers so they would ignore illegal after-hours bars and gambling operations, Federal prosecutors said. The pleas brought to 14 the number of people, including the Chief of the West New York Police Department, who have acknowledged participating in what Federal prosecutors have called the largest police corruption scheme in New Jersey history.
