Prosecutors To Retry Former East Ridge Police Officer posted December 5, 2006

Prosecutors plan to retry former East Ridge Police Officer Keith Maynard, who recently had his aggravated child molestation conviction overturned.

Maynard, 35, had served two years of a 30-year sentence, 10 of which were to be active time.

Maynard, who was convicted in Catoosa County in 2004, was released on a \$50,000 bond.

He was found quilty of two counts of aggravated child molestation and not quilty of two counts of statutory rape.

The case involved his relationship with a 15-year-old female member of the East Ridge Police Department's Explorer program.

A Georgia appeals court said prosecutors should not have been allowed to ask questions about his refusal to discuss the charges. The ruling also said testimony should not have been admitted about alleged sexual misconduct with two younger male cousins 20 years earlier.
