LAFOLLETTE — A LaFollette police officer was arrested for statutory rape today,

according to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.

Daniel Terry, 25, was indicted by a Campbell County grand jury on three counts of statutory rape against a 17-year-old girl and one count of official misconduct, said Kristin Helm, TBI spokeswoman.

Terry, who was an officer at the time the alleged offenses occurred, was booked into the Campbell County Jail this morning in lieu of \$15,000 bond. He had been suspended without pay since Feb. 22 after the TBI

announced its investigation.

LaFollette Police Chief James Lynch said today that Terry resigned from the police department Friday.
