NASHVILLE, GA (WALB) - A former Nashville Police officer convicted of soliciting sodomy from a teenager and violating his oath of office finds out his sentence.

Friday a judge sentenced James Watson was sentenced to five years in prison and fined him two thousand dollars.

He's also prohibited from having contact with the victim or his immediate family.

Prosecutors say Watson sent text messages and had telephone conversations with a 17-year old boy about having sex.

He's out on bond pending an appeal.
