

Sentencing postponed for ex-Pittsburgh Public Schools police officer who molested 4 boys THE ASSOCIATED PRESS October 08, 2013 - 5:18 pm EDT A A A

PITTSBURGH — A sentencing hearing has been postponed for a former Pittsburgh Public Schools police officer charged with molesting four boys in the late 1990s, when he pulled them out of class and forced them to perform sex acts in a middle school broom closet.

An Allegheny County jury convicted 44-year-old Robert Lellock, 44, of Pittsburgh, in July on 13 charges including indecent assault, endangering the welfare of children and corruption of minors.

Lellock has been jailed since. Sentencing is now scheduled for Oct. 22.

One of Lellock's victims, who is now 28, prompted the investigation when Pittsburgh police learned of his allegations last year. The man had previously told a drug and alcohol counselor that he was molested, and years later the state police, before Pittsburgh police launched their probe.
