

Secret Service officer indicted on underage sexting charge

A Secret Service officer was indicted Wednesday on charges he sent salacious texts and pictures — while on assignment at the White House — to an undercover cop posing as a 14-year-old girl, authorities said.

Lee Robert Moore, 37, was arrested Nov. 9 after he was caught sexting with the supposed teen for more than two months — even sending a picture of his manhood, authorities said.

Detectives with the Delaware Child Predator Task Force ensnared Moore after setting up a phony profile on the social media app Meet 24.

The married father of two from Maryland asked to meet the “minor” in a park near the Dover Air Force Base — and requested that she wear a skirt, according to court papers.

In their conversations over the Kik messaging app, Moore allegedly told “the girl” he wanted to make her have several orgasms and tried teaching her how to masturbate.

“I would take immense pleasure in pulling those shorts off your hips and down your cute little legs,” he wrote in chatlogs, according to the criminal complaint.

“All you have to do is enjoy it, tell me how much you're enjoying it, and moan when it feels good.”

Following his arrest, Moore admitted to police that he wanted to have sex with 14-year-old girls, court documents show.

A federal grand jury in the Delaware capital of Wilmington indicted Moore on one count of attempting to transfer obscene materials to a minor.

Moore, of Church Hill, faces up to 10 years behind bars, if convicted. His lawyer couldn't immediately be reached.

The case was brought as part of the Justice Department's Project Safe Childhood, a national initiative to combat the growing scourge of child sexual exploitation and abuse.
