

NYPD cop busted for exposing himself, making advances towards friend's 10-year-old daughter

Shaun Frazier, 39, was arrested around 7 a.m. and charged with acting in a manner injurious to a child following an NYPD Internal Affairs Bureau investigation.(NYPD)

An NYPD officer accused of exposing himself and making explicit sexual advances toward a friend's 10-year-old daughter was busted Thursday, police said.

Shaun Frazier, 39, was grabbed outside his Brooklyn home about 7 a.m. He allegedly licked the child's underwear and encouraged the child to watch as he pleased himself.

He was arrested following an NYPD Internal Affairs Bureau investigation and charged with endangering the welfare of a child.

Prosecutors said they are looking to see if any other criminal charges should be filed against Frazier.

Frazier was babysitting the girl and his friend's 5-year-old son on Sept. 5 when the girl found him in the kitchen licking her underwear, prosecutors said during his arraignment in Brooklyn Supreme Court.

"He (then) asked if he could lick her underwear," Brooklyn Assistant District Attorney Gwen Barnes said.

The stunned child ran to her bedroom, but Frazier allegedly "asked her to come into the room where he was on the mom's bed, where he was masturbating," Barnes said.

"He had his penis out," the prosecutor explained in disturbingly graphic detail. Frazier then asked the girl if she wanted to watch what he was doing to

himself, Barnes said.

Frazier's friend, a hospital security guard, was working an overnight shift when the five-year NYPD veteran allegedly made the twisted advances.

The girl tried to call her mother, but Frazier took the child's phone and didn't return it to her until he brought her to school the next day, prosecutors said.

Frazier denied the allegations in court. Defense attorney Daniel Servino said his client is a former court officer who is currently caring for his elderly mother, who has dementia.

"He does have so much to lose," Servino said.

Judge Donald Leo ordered him released without bail, despite Barnes' request to have Frazier held on \$10,000 bail. The judge also ordered orders of protection for the child, her mother and brother, officials said.

Reached at his Brooklyn home after his court appearance, Frazier repeated his denials to a Daily News reporter.

"I'm innocent. None of this even remotely happened," he said. "I can't talk because I'm a police officer. I'm already demonized. I'm a cop. It's already out there. I read it online. I'm a cop so I can't say anything."

Frazier joined the department in 2015 and was assigned to the NYPD's Building Maintenance Section, police said.

He's been suspended pending the outcome of his criminal case, cops said.

Frazier is the second officer in the department's maintenance unit to be arrested this week.

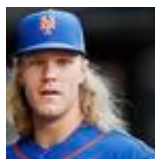
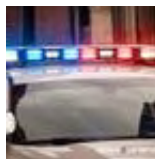
