


2007 Average Monthly Number of Reported Rape Victims, Rape Arrests, Prostitution Arrests vs. Suspected Incidents of Human Trafficking



5,460 x \$3,652= \$19,939,920 average spent per month [based on the 1987 estimate \$2,000 cost per arrest for prostitution adjusted for inflation in 2007]

Annual cost of prostitution arrests estimate: \$239,279,040

If the government really believed that human trafficking was as significant a problem as they claim, why would they continue to arrest consenting adults engaging in commercial sex rather than use that money to find and assist those human trafficking victims?

Monthly average stats based on the following annual statistics reported:

Human Tra	afficking	702 yearly suspected human trafficking cases (1229 /21 mo. = 58.52 mo x12)
	d Human Trafficking	70 confirmed cases (@10% of 1229 = 122.9 /21 mo= 5.8 mo x 12= 70.22)
Reported	Rapes/ Sexual Assaults	243,300 reported rapes sexual assaults (243,300 / 12 mo = 20,275)
Arrests fo	r Rape	18,925 arrests for rape (18,925 / 12= 1,577 mo)
Arrests fo	r Prostitution	65,521 arrests for prostitution (65,521/12= 5,460 mo)
